## WORKSHOP ON SUBJECTIVE EXPECTATIONS

Subjective expectations play a fundamental role in macro and microeconomic models. The area of subjective expectations has been growing rapidly over the last two decades. The first edition of the Handbook of Economic Expectations was [published](#) this year.

We invite scholars whose research contributes to this flourishing literature to submit their manuscripts to the Subjective Expectations Workshop to be held at Bocconi University. The goal of this workshop is to bring together junior and senior researchers using subjective expectations in their work and to foster and stimulate the exchange of ideas.

The workshop is the seventh in a series of workshops on Subjective Expectations. Previous workshops have been held at Université Laval in Québec city (2009 and 2011), the University of Essex ([2014](#)), New York Federal Reserve Bank ([2016](#)), CESifo in Munich ([2018](#)), and virtually ([2020](#)).
